Rutland City Ordinance Chapter 11 – Animals and Fowl – is available on the Rutland website. Ordinance 11.0201.1 limits the number of dogs and cats over six months to no more than five pets (in any combination). A special permit is required for households exceeding five animals. Contact the City Auditor for additional information at 724-3081.

Fees for pet licensing: \$ 10.00 for each neutered/spayed dog or cat. \$15.00 for each unneutered dog or cat. Licenses are good for one year; due annually July 1. Penalty of \$50 per pet will apply to any licenses not paid by August 1 and shall be added to the utility bill and be subject to all provisions of utility billing including late fees.

Owner must provide proof of Rabies Vaccination and Surgical Sterilization of each dog and/or cat. If original is provided, a copy will be made for City records.

License tags are issued upon initial application. Tags must be securely attached around the animal's neck and kept there at all times during the license period.
